Keith Hay Park site

About the Keith Hay Park construction site

Keith Hay Park is a main shaft site for the Central Interceptor tunnel which runs between Western Springs and the Māngere Wastewater Treatment Plant. It is the third site to begin construction and includes the main shaft site, control room and two pipeline connections into the nearby wastewater networks.

Site locations

The main site is in the park and on the property at 22 Gregory Place. Access to this site is from Arundel Place, by the entrance to the recreation facility carpark.


Once the main shaft is completed, we will build the pipeline connections to the local wastewater networks taking about three months. This work involves building the pipeline

underground, launched from smaller sites situated along the edge of the playing fields and at Frost Road. The sites in the park for the connection work will be accessed from Rainford Street.

Timing of the works

The works are due to start on 17 January 2020 and take some 14 months until approximately March 2021. We will then reinstate the sites back to their original state and do new planting which will enhance the walkways and other public spaces across the Park.


In 2022 the tunnelling machine will reach the shaft site, deep underground. Our contractor will return to site in early 2023 to connect the shaft to the new Central Interceptor tunnel.



Proposed work programme

The first work will be to divert part of the current cycleway around the main site location. This is followed by the site establishment of creating the accessway from Arundel Street and setting up site fencing. We will then demolish the house at 22 Gregory Place and prepare the site for the main shaft construction.

Working with you:

We understand that construction sites for major projects such as the Central Interceptor can be disruptive and noisy at times. We aim to be a good neighbour while we are working in your area and will work to minimise disruption, where we can.

We will keep you informed with what’s happening with regular communications. We will be out in your community during the works to meet with you and answer any questions you may have. Our contractor will hold a ‘Meet the Contractor’ community event before work starts (details below).

How will construction affect you?

- General work hours will be between 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, and 8am to 6pm on Saturday.
- Traffic management will be in place for the safety of motorists, pedestrians, cyclists and workers. Our trucks will generally operate between 7am and 6pm during the week and between 8am and 6pm on Saturday.
- Noise levels and vibration will be managed in accordance with Council requirements. Noise barriers and fences will be used during the works to minimise noise.
- There will be some parking restrictions at times on Arundel Street to provide a safe access for trucks entering and exiting the site.
